

Needle & syringe reach, by gender








Needle & syringe reach, by population group








Needle & syringe reach, by age








Needle & syringe distribution & return rate










TB testing & treatment cascade








HCV testing & treatment cascade








HBV testing








Opioid agonist therapy








Human rights violations





- Confiscation / destruction of injecting equipment
- Confiscation / destruction of injecting equipment and assaulted
- Confiscation / destruction of injecting equipment and arrested
- Confiscation / destruction of injecting equipment and personal photos taken without consent
- Confiscation / destruction of injecting equipment and medication taken
- Assaulted
- Falsely arrested

Issues & challenges



- Ongoing gang violence in Mitchells Plain disrupting service delivery
- Client migration and long travel distances limiting access to care
- Temporary halt of services in Joe Slovo due to local opposition (later resolved through engagement with the councilor)
- Sensitization training conducted with City of Cape Town Sub-Councils
- Continued reports of needle confiscations and assaults by Law Enforcement, Byers Security, SAPS, and PRASA
- Fear of stigma and discrimination affecting service uptake
- Limited resources and poor adherence to treatment
- Restricted access to healthcare, rehabilitation, and mental health services



Successes



- Increased awareness of human rights and safe injecting practices
- Reduced needle confiscations and client harassment
- Higher participation in Legal Literacy sessions
- •Fewer needles found in public areas
- Clients reconnecting with families and demonstrating positive behavior
- Several clients gained employment
- Needle returns exceeded distribution
- •All HIV Testing Services and program targets met ahead of schedule
- Strong overall program performance
