

Needle & syringe reach, by gender








Needle & syringe reach, by population group








Needle & syringe reach, by age






Needle & syringe distribution & return rate







HIV testing & treatment cascade








TB testing & treatment cascade








HCV testing & treatment cascade







Opioid substitution therapy








Mortality & overdose

Issues & challenges



- Ongoing human rights violations that are affecting service delivery.
- Private security companies, Police, neighborhood watch who continue violating clients despite sensitizations done. The team has managed to gain some support from a neighborhood watch member who is sensitized and understand the impact of harm reduction services and through this we are hoping to infiltrate other neighborhood watch members to prevent victimization of our priority population.
- Adherence to medication is especially difficult to our priority population, the HTS team is doing individual adherence plans and adherence groups to support PWID with an unsuppressed viral load.





Successes

- The OST program is ongoing and there are many success stories, including clients who
 have found employment and clients who have been reunified with their families. Take
 home dosages have started and monitored. We have families who have come on board
 to collect medication with clients and those buddies who are fetching on behalf of
 those who are working.
- TB HIV Care-NMB launched an Overdose Prevention Programme in December 2024. This
 program entails taking steps to limit the risk of overdose while responding to an
 overdose by delivering naloxone (opioid overdose reversal) and directing clients to
 the hospital. The clinical team has provided educational trainings on overdose
 prevention and naloxone administration to beneficiaries' parents and support
 partners. Target: 25 OST clients and 26 Non-OST clients- Buddy
