




EC SERVICE USERS IN TREATMENT





EC POPULATION PROFILE: GENDER











TYPE OF TREATMENT RECEIVED (%)





EC EMPLOYMENT STATUS




EC AGE DISTRIBUTION



MEAN AGE BY PERIOD













EC PRIOR HIV TESTING UPON ADMISSION








HIV TESTING REFERRAL



WHERE DO SERVICE USERS RESIDE












ROUTE OF ADMINISTRATION






EC PRIMARY SUBSTANCE OF USE BY GENDER



TOP 5 PSOA BY MEAN AGE/MEAN AGE OF INITIATION



















FIRST TIME ADMISSIONS (Mean = 1 prior admission)








READMISSIONS BY AGE CAT








READMISSIONS PER GENDER





NCD BY SELECTED PRIMARY SUBSTANCE










Primary substance of use by NCD (National data: annual glance n = 2311)














TOBACCO USE (n = 218, 65%)











GENDER FOR 18 YEARS AND UNDER





PRIMARY SUBTANCE OF USE 18 AND UNDER



EASTERN CAPE SUMMARY



- Increase in proportion of females accessing treatment
- Decrease in readmissions; mean: 1 prior tx episodes
- Largest age category accessing treatment is 35-39; followed by 15-19 and 30-34
- Decrease in service users accessing treatment between 15-19.
- Increase in those that are employed.
- Increase in 'Employer' referrals
- Most used primary substances: alcohol, dagga, MA (Increases in alcohol; decreases in dagga)
- Most used secondary substances: dagga and alcohol (increase in alcohol; decrease in dagga)
- Mean age of primary substance use initiation: 19
- Mean age of primary substance treatment access: 34
- Majority codeine users: Male; largest age category reporting codeine use 40-44; employed.
- Decrease in young people reported this period; notable increase in females
- Increase in 18 and under MA use; decrease in crack/cocaine and dagga/mandrax
