SAMRC Internship Scholarship Programme Masters and PhD Scholarships for Clinical/Health Research

SAMRC INTRA AND EXTRA-MURAL RESEARCH UNITS

The objective of the SAMRC Internship Scholarship Programme is primarily to transform the composition of the country's health and clinical research human capital to be more representative of the demographics of the nation. Within the context of the SAMRC, the SAMRC Internship Scholarship Programme is specifically designed to open an opportunity to develop Black Scientists i.e., African Black, Coloured, and Indian scientists through PhD training. Preference will be given to candidates registered for a doctoral degree or MSc in scarce skills and strategic and/or emerging research areas.

The purpose of this Request for Applications (RFA) is to attract black scientists in the following research fields, which will be given preference: Biostatistics, Bioethics, Bioinformatics, Data Science, Digital Health, Demography, Epidemiology, Evolutionary Virology, Implementation Science, Health Economics, Genomics, Immunology and Structural Biology.

Requirements for application

- 1) South African citizen or permanent resident.
- 2) Black candidate (African Black/Coloured/Indian).
- 3) A fully developed and officially approved research proposal for the MSc/PhD.
- 4) Must be registered as a full-time student at a South African university.
- 5) Research project must fall within the SAMRC priority research areas.
- 6) Current registration at the university in which the degree will be awarded.
- 7) Must provide written commitment of participation by a research unit director from SAMRC intramural unit or SAMRC extramural unit or SAMRC research centre who is willing to host the student for the entire duration of the degree.
- 8) Must be receiving supervisory support from SAMRC intramural unit or SAMRC extramural unit or SAMRC research centre who is willing to train the student for the entire duration of the degree.
- 9) The hosting research unit or supervisor must have research funding for the project and appropriate facilities for the scholar to effectively conduct the research project.

Application Process

Application steps 1 to 2 below must be completed before or by 22 February 2024, 23:59.

- Step 1 Complete the <u>online application</u> and upload all the required supporting documents (see page 7-8).
- Step 2 Main research supervisor must complete the research supervisor's commitment form

Scholarship Conditions

- Scholarship holders are expected to spend at least 90% of their time conducting research towards their studies.
- Teaching and clinical activities may not take up more than 10% of the time of the scholar.
- Scholarship holders may not receive, concurrently with this scholarship, other bursaries, grants, or remuneration which bind them to enter the service of any organization without prior agreement of the SAMRC.
- Candidates may not hold a bursary from more than one South African Government or statutory entity at any given time.
- Scholarship holders may not receive, concurrently with this scholarship, other non-binding remuneration/fellowships, and grants without prior agreement of the SAMRC.
- Scholarship holders may not, without seeking approval from the SAMRC, register at a university other than that through which the application has been submitted.
- Once the scholarship has been awarded, the scholarship holder may not change his/her supervisor or research project without informing the SAMRC.
- Scholar will be expected to submit six-monthly progress reports endorsed by the supervisor.
- Application for renewal of funding will be considered on an annual basis, and success thereof will be subject to satisfactory progress being made.
- Successful applicants will be required to enter into an agreement with the SAMRC to complete their studies within the specified period.

Protection of Personal Information Act (POPIA)

As of the 1st of July 2020, the new Protection of Personal Information Act (POPIA) came into full effect. The law is designed to protect how all juristic persons use, store and process data. You can read the full details on the act here: https://popia.co.za/

The SAMRC as a responsible statutory science council will comply with POPIA. The SAMRC will receive personal information through applications submitted to the SAMRC for the purposes of applying for funding. The personal information requested on the application template is necessary for the SAMRC to fully evaluate the applications for funding. This information will be shared with members of Scholarship Selection Committees of the SAMRC and external funders and/or stakeholders where applicable as well as the SAMRC management for the purposes of processing the applications. The SAMRC will process this personal information strictly in accordance with POPIA. The SAMRC undertakes specifically to process the personal information on the basis that (a) it was provided voluntarily and (b) the information will be processed only as far may be necessary and within the limitation and ambit of the purpose of evaluating the application for funding (i.e., the purpose with which the personal information was received). The SAMRC confirms that it is lawfully processing the information since the purpose of processing is to seek quality research proposals for funding which the SAMRC is mandated to do in terms of Section 4 of the SAMRC Act 58 of 1991, thus the SAMRC is fulfilling its legislated and lawful mandate, and strategic objectives as provided for in the SAMRC Act.
