Professor Nuala McGrath Epidemiology and Sexual Health

Professor Nuala McGrath is Professor of Epidemiology and Sexual Health at the University of Southampton, UK and, holds a Global Health professorship from the National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR), UK.

Professor McGrath has more than 30 years of experience in HIV surveillance, treatment and prevention studies and intervention trials in sub-Saharan Africa. She is an Honorary Professor at the School of Nursing and Public Health, University of KwaZulu-Natal, and part of the Faculty of the Africa Health Research Institute, KwaZulu-Natal.

Professor McGrath received her undergraduate degree in Mathematics, Statistics and Operational Research (University of Exeter, UK); a Masters in Biometry (University of Reading, UK); and a Doctorate in Infectious Disease Epidemiology (Harvard School of Public Health, USA). She was a Wellcome Trust Research Career Development Fellow (2008-2015), has lived in the USA, Tanzania, Uganda, Malawi, and South Africa, and has previously held Honorary appointments with the Human Sciences Research Council, South Africa, and University College London, UK.

In partnership with Prof. Naomi Levitt and the Chronic Disease Initiative for Africa (CDIA) Group at the University of Cape Town, Professor McGrath has developed a couples focused intervention to support Type-2 diabetes self-management. In the presentation, she will share how they developed the intervention, findings and the teams' plans for evaluation.
