 Research awardees who have not spent all funds in a particular year must specifically request the carry forward of such funding into the subsequent year within their renewal application. The SAMRC reserves the right to adjust approved research funds based on submitted annual progress reports.

Awardees are required to attend all training and support workshops organised by the SAMRC RCD
 Successful applicants will be required to enter into an agreement with the SAMRC to complete their studies within the specified time period.

• If awarded, applicants must be able to take up the award immediately.

 The scholarship is for the specified enrolment year, and therefore cannot be deferred to the subsequent years.

Awardees are expected to conduct the research in accordance with the approved research proposal and budget.

Once awarded funding, awardees are not allowed to move between RCD scholarship programmes and funding categories (e.g., full-time to part-time)
