### **About BM-NHSP**

The Bongani Mayosi National Health Scholars Programme (BM-NHSP) is an initiative by the National Health Research Committee (NHRC) and a partnership between the National Department of Health (NDoH), the Public Health Enhancement Fund (PHEF) and the South African Medical Research Council (SAMRC). The objective of the BM-NHSP is to fund the training of 1000 PhDs in health and clinical research over a 10-year period.

The aim of the BM-NHSP is to contribute positively towards efforts to strengthen and accelerate progress towards equity in research in line with the South African National Department of Health (NDoH) human resource for health strategy and the national health research priorities. The purpose is to attract and enable health professionals to access PhD research opportunities in a university environment and thereby strengthen their research profiles and consequently improve their prospects of permanent employment within the health/clinical research space. The BM-NHSP is designed to develop a vibrant and transformed health research academic pipeline in SA that is adequately equipped to train healthcare workers and inspire a new generation of health/clinical researchers.

### **The 2026 BM-NHSP Request for Applications (RFA)**

Applications are invited for PhD scholarships for study at South African universities. Funding is towards the completion of the degree and is made available for a full degree period (i.e. prescribed time for a PhD) as a tax-free scholarship for full-time study. The value of the scholarship is equivalent to the after-tax take-

home package of the applicant, in terms of the South African Government public service professional scales applicable to the qualification(s) of the candidate (excluding overtime pay). Applicants are to note that, once the benchmarking process has been completed (based on the criteria at the time) and a scholarship amount has been awarded, it will remain fixed for the full duration of the studies, irrespective of a change in circumstances, such as, for example, additional qualifications/credentials obtained or an increase in Occupation Specific Dispensation scales.

The purpose of this RFA is to build capacity in clinical and health research through doctoral-level research training. The current funding opportunity is targeting health professionals who are registered with the Health Professions Council of South Africa: Professional nurses, Occupational therapists, Optometrists, Biostatisticians, Social Workers, Demographers, Physiotherapists, Pharmacists, Psychologists, Medical Practitioners and Medical Scientists who are currently enrolled for a PhD and conducting research in the following national research priority areas:

1. Health System Strengthening (i.e. Quality, Human Resources, Supply Chain)
2. Early Detection of Non-Communicable Diseases (e.g. access, diagnostics, surveillance).
3. Public Health Innovation towards Health Promotion and Disease Prevention (e.g. HIV Elimination)

**Requirements for application (Please check your eligibility before you apply).**

- 1) Must be a South African citizen or permanent resident.
- 2) Applicants must hold a master's degree.
- 3) Must have an officially approved PhD research proposal.
- 4) The PhD research proposal must already have ethics approval or be under review at the time of application.
- 5) Must be registered as a full-time PhD student at a South African university at the commencement of the award.
- 6) Must provide a written commitment of participation from an experienced research supervisor who is willing to train the student for the entire duration of the degree.
- 7) The research supervisor must have research funding for the project and appropriate facilities for the scholar to effectively conduct the PhD research project.

8. Applicant's Cover Letter: <b>Max. 1 page:</b> Motivation demonstrating the candidate's suitability and describing how success in the BM-NHSP application will impact the candidate's career.	
9. Applicant's Curriculum vitae: A curriculum vitae containing a full list of research outputs for the last seven years and other meritorious achievements. Include all awards received e.g. scholarships/bursaries, research awards, etc.	
10. Abstract (Quality of the research): <b>Max. 2 pages:</b> Abstract of the PhD proposal outlining the rationale, design, feasibility, plans for research translation and information dissemination as well as potential impact of the proposed research project. <b>NB: The proposed research project must be aligned with the priority research areas for this specific call.</b>	
11. Research support Letter: <b>Max. 1-page:</b> A letter from the host institution confirming that it will provide the necessary facilities to enable the scholar to effectively conduct the PhD research project. The letter must also specify the availability of project research funding and clearly list all institutional contributions (financial or in-kind, e.g., laboratory space). The letter must be signed by the Head of Department.	
12. Certified copy of the applicant's South African identity document (must be certified by a Commissioner of Oaths and <b>must not be older than 6 months</b> )

### **Application Process**

Application steps 1 to 3 below must be completed on or before the specified deadlines.

- Step 1 – Applicant to complete the [online application](#) form by **9 July 2026**.
- Step 2 – Applicant to upload all the required supporting documents by **9 July 2026**.
- Step 3 – The research supervisor must complete the research supervisor's abridged track record and commitment form and submit the application before or by **16 July 2026**.

**The South African Medical Research Council reserves the right to disqualify ineligible, incomplete and/or inappropriate applications, change the conditions of the award, extend the closing date, or make no awards at all. Please note that only successful candidates will be contacted after completion of the review, selection, and approval processes. Should you not hear from the SAMRC by 30 November 2026, please assume that your application has been unsuccessful.**

### **Scholarship Conditions**

- Scholarship holders are expected to spend at least 80% of their time conducting research.
- Teaching and clinical activities may not take up more than 20% of the time of the scholar.
- Candidates may not hold a bursary from more than one South African Government statutory entity at any given time.
- Scholarship holders may not receive, concurrently with this scholarship, other bursaries, grants or remuneration which bind them to enter the service of any organization without prior agreement of the SAMRC.
- Scholarship holders may not receive, concurrently with this scholarship, other non-binding remuneration/fellowships and grants without prior agreement on engagement.
- Scholarship recipients will be required to declare the value of any other scholarship(s) or award(s), whether in cash or in-kind or direct payments into their personal bank accounts that they may hold for the same study programme.
- Scholarship holders may not, without seeking approval from the SAMRC, register at a university other than that through which the application has been submitted.
- Once the scholarship has been awarded, the scholarship holder may not change his/her supervisor without informing the SAMRC.
- Application for renewal of funding will be considered on an annual basis, and success thereof will be subject to satisfactory progress being made.
- Continuation of funding is subject to the submission of a satisfactory progress report from both student and supervisor.

- The scholarship is for the specified enrolment year and therefore cannot be deferred to subsequent years.

Successful applicants will be required to sign acceptance of the SAMRC Scholarship terms and conditions.
